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**Meeting Called To Order**

Mayor Rudy Boonstra called the regular meeting of the Wyckoff Township Committee in the Municipal Court Room to order at 8:00 pm.

**Flag Salute**

The Township Committee proceeded with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Boy Scouts.

**Invocation**

The Invocation was given by Mayor Rudy Boonstra.

**Open Public Meeting Act Statement**

Municipal Clerk Santimauro read the "Open Public Meeting Act" Statement: "This regular meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff is now in session. In accordance with the provisions of Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, I wish to advise that notice of this meeting has been posted in the lower level of the Memorial Town Hall and that a copy of the schedule of meetings has also been filed with the Township Clerk, and copies of this agenda and the annual notice of meetings, of which this is a part, have been heretofore sent to the Ridgewood News, The Record, and The North Jersey Herald and News all papers with general circulation throughout the Township of Wyckoff. At least 48 hours prior to this meeting the Agenda thereof was similarly posted, filed and mailed to said newspapers."

**Attendance**

**Township Committee Present:** Mayor Rudolf E. Boonstra; Committee Present: Douglas J. Christie, Kevin J. Rooney, Brian D. Scanlan and Haakon C. Jepsen.

**Staff Present:** Township Administrator Robert J. Shannon, Joyce C. Santimauro, Municipal Clerk and Township Attorney Robert Landel.

The Township Committee voted unanimously to open the public portion of the meeting.

Mr. Jerry Goetting whom resides at 629 Lawlins Road expressed his objections regarding the Wyckoff Police Department contract as it relates to salaries, the small amount of money police officers contribute towards health benefits and the negotiation process of the next police contract.

Township Attorney Robert Landel addressed Mr. Goetting and explained to him that the contract negotiation process was confidential.

Mr. Jerry Goetting also asked how many tax appeals were filed from the residents of Wyckoff and objected to the mandatory revaluation order, the cost of the revaluation and he opined that the tax assessor should perform a re-assessment.

Committeeman Kevin Rooney directed Mr. Goetting to read the Township Committee Meeting Minutes from March 27, 2013 where the mandated revaluation was discussed by the committee in length.

Mr. Jerry Goetting also questioned why the front steps of Town Hall were being renovated?

The Township Administrator Robert J. Shannon addressed Mr. Goetting regarding the front steps of Town Hall. Mr. Shannon explained to Mr. Goetting that two grants from the Bergen County Community Development Block Grant program were awarded to the Township of Wyckoff for ADA access renovations. The first grant provided for the reconstruction of the crumbling ramp at the west wing of Town Hall to be renovated and included an ADA compliant automatic door and railing making the west wing entrance 100% ADA compliant; the

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second grant awarded was for the front steps of Town Hall. Elderly residents have expressed concern about the previous configuration and level of the front steps, some people have fallen and have been injured on the front steps and landing of Town Hall before the renovation. The new front steps have been raised and re-designed to have an extended and wider landing, and the new front door is ADA compliant making the front entrance of Town Hall even more safe for everyone especially our senior citizens.

Mr. John Unglert, whom resides at 360 Cornell Street, approached the Township Committee expressing his sincere thanks to Committeemen Kevin Rooney and Doug Christie for the professional work done on limiting the 2013 Township of Wyckoff budget. Mr. Unglert also asked about Ridgewood Water litigation.

Mayor Rudy Boonstra addressed Mr. Unglert letting him know that the litigation is an ongoing process. Mayor Boonstra could not go into details about the Ridgewood water suit because it is still in litigation.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Municipal Clerk will forward a copy of this resolution to Recreation Director Andy Wingfield; Chief of Police Ben Fox and DPW Manager Scott Fisher, Library Director Mary Witherell, Fire Chief Lou Graglia and Ambulance Corps Captain Charles Ballucci for their use in traffic control/detours awareness and coordinating the parade process safely.

**#13-132      Authorized a Shared Service Agreement – Lending of Vehicles & Equipment**

**WHEREAS**, the Municipalities of Wyckoff, Oakland and Franklin Lakes have formed a shared service group known as The WOLF SHARED SERVICE GROUP; and

**WHEREAS**, representatives of all three municipalities meet frequently to identify common areas where saving and/or cost avoidance may be achieved through volume purchasing to capture discount pricing or shared agreements to benefit

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our tax payers; and

**WHEREAS**, the WOLF Group has achieved many successful shared efforts such as; savings through volume bidding for annual recreation equipment, PEOSHA mandate compliance and garbage disposal; and

**WHEREAS**, a shared lending agreement between the three municipalities that comprise the WOLF Group will increase services to the public, while decreasing operational cost for each municipality.

**NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that the Mayor and Municipal Clerk are authorized to execute the WOLF Shared Service Group agreement for the lending of vehicles and equipment.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that a copy of this agreement shall be provided by the Municipal Clerk to the Public Work Manager, the CFO, the Administrator and the Township Risk Management Consultant who assists the Township with its participation in the Bergen JIF and MEL insurance consortium.

**#13-133      Authorize Polling Place Locations at Private Properties**

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff has announced the relocation of voting locations from four schools operated by the K – 8 school at district and relocation of those voting locations to two municipal properties and two Houses of Worship; and

**WHEREAS**, due to the generosity of the congregations of the Faith Community Christian Reformed Church and the Cedar Hill Christian Reformed Church voting locations have been relocated to their facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, the ADA parking signage and parking stalls require updating for code compliance; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of Wyckoff Public Works Department proposed to update the ADA signage and parking stall painting as a reciprocal service for the congregation allowing use of their facility for voting

**NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey that the DPW is authorized to perform the updating of ADA Parking requirements at the aforementioned two Houses of Worship in consideration for the use of facilities for the primary and general elections.

**WHEREAS**, the Wyckoff Volunteer Fire Chief has indicated to the Township Committee that the 1989 Mack Fire Rescue apparatus is no longer needed for public use; and

**#13-136      Authorize Recycling Tonnage Grant Application**

**WHEREAS**, the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act, P.L. 1987, c.102, has established a recycling fund from which tonnage grant may be made to municipalities in order to encourage local source separation and recycling programs; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the intent and the spirit of the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act to use the tonnage grants to develop new municipal recycling

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programs and to continue and to expand existing programs; and

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection has promulgated recycling regulations to Implement the Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act; and

**WHEREAS**, the recycling regulations impose on municipalities certain requirements as a condition for applying for tonnage grants, including but not limited to, making and keeping accurate, verifiable records of materials collected and claimed by the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, a resolution authorizing this municipality to apply for the 2012 Recycling Tonnage Grant will memorialize the commitment of this municipality to recycling and to indicate the assent of the Township of Wyckoff to the efforts undertaken by the municipality and the requirements contained in the Recycling Act and recycling regulations; and

**WHEREAS**, such a resolution should designate the individual authorized to ensure the application is properly completed and timely filed.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff that the Township of Wyckoff hereby endorses the submission of the recycling tonnage grant application to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and designates Scott Fisher, Township Certified Recycling Professional, to ensure that the application is properly filed;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the monies received from the recycling tonnage grant be deposited in a dedicated recycling trust fund to be used solely for the purposes of recycling.

**#13-138      Supporting S-1896/A-1503 Sharing the Burden of Property Assessment Appeal Refunds**

**WHEREAS**, when County Tax Board appeals are granted the municipality must reimburse the property taxpayer 100% of the appealed tax levy, which includes the municipal, school, county and any special districts tax; and

**WHEREAS**, the municipal tax collector makes the adjustment from the appeal as a credit on the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter tax bill resulting in the municipality's fund balance for the preceding year to diminished , if not completely depleted; and

**WHEREAS**, a League of Municipalities' survey measured the extent to which residents have filed and won tax appeals in 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, one hundred fifty (150) municipalities, representing both large and small municipalities in all 21 counties, that participated in the survey reported property value declines of more than \$87,900,000, which resulted from 19,788 tax appeals filed in 2010; and

**WHEREAS**, those responding to the survey indicated that 13,760 appeals were filed in 2009, compared to 19,788 in 2010, representing an increase of 43.7%; and

**WHEREAS**, a municipality often experiences an increase in tax appeals because it has conducted a revaluation, however, only 5 of the 150 municipalities, which participated in our survey, indicated that their 2010 appeals resulted from revaluations; and

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**WHEREAS**, as a way of comparison, 23 of the participating municipalities conducted revaluations in 2009, when fewer tax appeals were presented to the County Tax Boards; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2010 spike in appeals should be attributed to the economic down-turn, which lowered property values and placed increased stress on the income of homeowners, all around our Garden State; and

**WHEREAS**, the survey also indicated that in 2010 the various County Tax Boards have granted average property value reductions of close to \$5,000, per appeal; and

**WHEREAS**, fifty-six percent of those responding indicated that the successful tax appeals would have an impact on fund balances and place additional pressures on local officials during 2011; and

**WHEREAS**, the reductions, which were granted by County Tax Boards in 2010, likely had a multiplier in subsequent years when neighbors learned of their neighbor's tax reduction; and

**WHEREAS**, successful tax appeals have a three-fold negative impact on municipal budgets. First, the municipality, as the collector of taxes for the School district, county and special districts, must fund the full cost of the legal defense of the assessment. Second, since State law guarantees to the county and the school district 100% of their levies, the municipality bears the full cost of any reimbursements resulting from the appeal (as well as the full burden for any uncollected taxes). Third, the end result will be a further decline in the property tax base used to support Municipalities, County governments and School systems; and

**WHEREAS**, in light of the revenue limitations that have been placed on all levels of local government by the Legislature (2% cap), such declining values will compound and add additional stress to local public officials, as they grapple with the issues confronting the taxpaying public; and

**WHEREAS**, Senator Bucco, Assemblyman Carroll and Assemblyman Bucco have recently introduced S-1896/A-1503, which requires fire districts, school districts, and county governments to share in burden of property assessment appeal refunds;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Wyckoff Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff hereby urge the swift passage and signing of S-1896/A-1503; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that copies of this Resolution be forwarded to New Jersey Governor Christopher Christie, to Senate President Stephen Sweeney, to Assembly Speaker Sheila Oliver, to our State Senator, to our two Representatives in the General Assembly, and to the New Jersey League of Municipalities.

ORDINANCE #1709

**AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK**

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff in the County of Bergen find it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2013 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 1.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$188,616.00 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Committee of the Township of Wyckoff in the County of Bergen authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring that, in the CY 2013 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Wyckoff shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S. A. 40A:4-45, be increased by 1.5% amounting to \$188,616.00 and that the CY 2013 municipal budget for the Township of Wyckoff

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be approved and adopted in accordance with the ordinance; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Direction within 5 days after such adoption.
